

Sunburn	Visiting Children, Team Leaders, Teachers and Staff	Likely	Harmful	When applicable, Activity Leaders to monitor the participants, paying particular attention to sunscreen and suitable clothing (school staff to apply suncream, not staff)	Activity Leaders to ensure sunscreen is available.	Low
Lightning	Visiting Children, Team Leaders, Teachers and Staff	Highly Unlikely	Fatal	Activity Leader not to take participants out in a lightning storm. If caught out in a lightning storm, then Activity Leader must take the participants to the safest place to shelter during the storm.	Activity Leaders to check forecast prior to activity.	Low

There will be one Activity Leader riding at the front and one at the back at all times. They will make sure there is visual contact at all times. Both Leaders will have a mobile phone to make contact with each other.		Low

Mountain bike riders (MTB) colliding with walking groups using the same route/bike track	Visiting Children, Team Leaders, Teachers and Staff and public	Likely	Very Harmful	It is the responsibility of the Centre Director/Programme Leaders (Soli, Castle, BCYS and or Summer Camp co-ordinators) to ensure that they have de-conflicted their respective rides to prevent possible collisions.	Centre Director/Programme Leaders to communicate effectively.	Low
Being hit by vehicles whilst crossing or walking along tracks or roads	Visiting Children, Team Leaders, Teachers and Staff and public	Unlikely	Very Harmful	Few tracks/roads are used on the route. The first and last group member (team) must wear high visibility Kit Bags. The Centre is in communication with Forestry England and are informed of logging operations in Dimmingsdale.	Single road crossing at Dimmingsdale/Ramblers Retreat fully supervised by Activity Leaders and Teacher.	Low
























Individuals unable to ride a bike or unsuited to the ride	Visiting Children, Team Leaders, Teachers and Staff	Unlikely	Harmful	Expectations will be made clear to the group in advance. Activity Leader (MBLA L1) can refuse to take a group member on a bike ride on lack of ability and safety grounds. An assessment exercise will be undertaken prior to leaving on the bike ride to ascertain each group member's ability. This will involve getting on and off the bike, riding, steering, braking, and manoeuvring. Anyone deemed by the Activity Leader not to be able to safely ride a bike, will be moved to an alternative activity.		Low
Livestock/horses	Visiting Children, Team Leaders, Teachers and Staff	Likely	Harmful	Group management through fields containing livestock. Activity Leaders will instruct riders to dismount and place the bike between them and any approaching horse on a bridal way.	Activity Leaders to dynamically assess whether it is necessary to walk with bikes in single file through fields containing livestock.	
Falling off bikes due to uneven/ rough terrain on tracks/travelling too fast/steep gradients	Visiting Children, Team Leaders, Teachers and Staff	Likely	Very Harmful	Group members are briefed on the nature of the tracks prior to departure. Activity Leaders to adjust the speed at which the group is travelling to suit the changing ground conditions/surface type. Any new hazards to be reported by Activity Leaders to Activities Manager or Programme Leaders. The first descent of the bike ride is as a group "braked roll". Activity leaders to fully	Activity Leaders are to dynamically assess riders' abilities and ground conditions and particularly at the steep field leading down to the bridge and river crossing dismount riders through hazardous areas. Following a serious accident (RIDDOR reportable) the bike involved must be taken offline until it can be fully checked by the KYT Mechanic. All bike faults are reported and taken out of use until the bike is repaired.		Low
