Reflect on the video. What parts of the experiment stood out? How can we replicate this in our own lives to bring about more happiness?

BREAK

Have an option/break out discussion on influence. Discuss who we are most influenced by - negative influences, positive influences. Then talk about what makes a good influence, and what makes a bad one. Write a letter to the person in your life who has influenced you the most. Why are they such a great influence? What have they done for you that you are thankful for? Let them know just how much you appreciate them and how much you value them. Take the letter away with you and if you have the opportunity, why not pass it on to the person you wrote to? Remember the greater the gratitude the greater the happiness!

10'000 Reasons Blessings Wall:

Give your young people an opportunity to count their blessings.

Write down or draw a blessing in your life. What are you thankful for?

Using a washing line and pegs, or a plain wall and sticky notes, whatever works! Attach all of the blessings to the line and this can be built upon each week at youth group to cultivate an attitude of gratitude. Maybe even keep going until you have 10'000 reasons to thank God!

Play 10,000 Reasons by Matt Redman for young people to reflect upon the lyrics whilst writing down their blessings!

You are beauty. You are gentleness. You are our protector.


